

September 2, 2018 | Romans 3:21-31 | "Aren't all Religions Equal?"

It seems arrogant, in our age of skepticism, to claim that ours is the *true* religion and everyone must convert to it to be saved. This sermon provides the rationale of Christianity which provides a unique hope not found in other faiths.

September 9, 2018 | Matthew 2:13-18 | "Good God Allows Suffering?"

When we are told that God is both good and powerful, it can be difficult to understand how suffering is allowed to continue. Is God not good or is he not powerful? This sermon offers a third option which results in the possibility of our suffering being redeemed.

September 16, 2018 | Revelation 20:11-15 | "Loving God Sends People to Hell?"

From the culture's standpoint, the doctrine of hell is one of the most difficult to understand and accept. It seems to distinguish between people (inequality) and calls into question the love of God. This sermon seeks to show that even hell is rooted in God's love and human (bent) desire.

September 23, 2018 | Galatians 5:13-17 | "Christianity is a Straitjacket"

Imagine the Riders coach threw out the rulebook and told the players to just do what feels good to them on the field. Is there any validity to the claim that Christian faith practice is a straitjacket? What does it mean for us to put on Jesus easy yoke and learn from him?

September 30, 2018 | Matthew 8:1-4 | "Science has Disproved Christianity"

Stories of creation, miracles, and the resurrection are all things the modern day atheist have trouble believing. In fact, much of science and atheism tells us we must reject belief in God in order to be thinking people. This sermon contends that one does not need to cease thinking to be a Christian, rather Christianity has an orderliness and rationality to it.

October 7, 2018 | 2 Timothy 3:14-17 | "Can't Take the Bible Literally"

Many claim the Bible is historically inaccurate at best, and oppressive to certain peoples at worst. Because of this Christians shouldn't take the Bible to be as authoritative as they do. This sermon points out the need to allow God to contradict our wills in order to be a truly personal relationship.
