MISSION

Our mission is to embody Jesus in our neighbourhoods

CULTURE

Scripture Centred

We believe that Scripture, understood through the person of Jesus, should be at the centre of who we are and what we are to do. By doing this we ensure that we remain kingdom focused.

Community Oriented

We believe the community called church is a new family. This means we intentionally invite people to become a part of our life together. As well, we foster an environment in which we openly share what is happening in our lives with each other and seek to respond to each other with love and concern. We also seek to be a place of healing for all people.

Spiritually Equipped

We believe that God has gifted his body of believers, men and women equally, for the work of discipling and mission. Every believer has been equipped by God's Spirit to build up the body and/or to do works of service for the world. Everyone is encouraged to discover their gifts and share them to the best of their ability.

Missionally Minded

We believe that mission is the reason for the church's existence. Scripture describes God's great mission to redeem and renew all of his creation, particularly humanity. God has called us to participate in that mission, in the power and under the direction of the Holy Spirit.

Discipleship Focused

We believe that God is transforming us into the image of his Son. This means that we are intentionally submitting ourselves to be re-formed through daily practices that lead to spiritual growth. We also recognize that at the heart of our mission as a church, we are to disciple others through those same daily practices.

Prayer Dependent

We believe that prayer is essential to following after God. Like Jesus, we need frequent times when we are seeking God for a reaffirmation of our identity as God's people and a reminder of our mission. Like Scripture, prayer is a major discipline for our corporate body.

Worship Driven

We believe that authentic worship is everything that honours God. Worshiping God is the greatest fulfilment of our vocation to be bearers of God's image. Worship is an individual and corporate whole life offering which is grounded in our regular gathering for that purpose. Worship is about God first and last.



Importance of Community

Many of us have been taught to think about the Christian faith and the joy of salvation in individual terms. As a result, Christian community can be viewed as an 'extra' that is nice on occasion, but largely unimportant to the life of the believer. This perspective on community is simply bad theology.

While faith and salvation are personal they are never individual. As we attend to the narrative of Scripture we learn that God's mission is to redeem and renew his creation that is represented by his image-bearing humanity—every tribe, tongue and nation. When Israel is rescued through the Exodus it is the people of Israel as a whole, through whom God will redeem the nations, that is saved. When Jesus comes to redeem humanity from the power of sin he establishes his church, through whom the whole world will hear the good news.

One of the most fundamental claims of the Christian faith is that salvation is not simply reconciliation between me and God. Instead, it is also reconciliation between people—those like us and those unlike us. Baptism, in addition to incorporation into Christ, is incorporation into Christ's body, the church. This incorporation itself is a means of grace, as we cannot live the Christian life apart from the whole body of Christ. In this way the church—you and I in reconciled community—is an icon of God's redemption to the world.

So, Christian community is a foretaste of God's world to come that is meant to be experienced by our neighbours through us. This makes Christian community essential to our witness as we seek to embody Jesus in our neighbourhoods. Furthermore, this essential dynamic means that we must be

An important way of being connected at Northview is through our church's Photo Directory. Become a Partner

As a part of the Free Methodist Church in Canada we use the language of Partnership rather than Membership. "Membership" tends to be a bit static, indicating that this is where I go to church. Whereas "Partnership" is dynamic, reflecting our conviction that we are here to engage in God's mission.

As people who are new to Northview get better connected with us, we want to ensure that we are focused on being a *Christian* community. This means that *mission* is at the centre of who we are and what we do as a community.

As such, we offer a Partnership class on a regular basis (we have them scheduled, but we will also do them as there is interest). In the Partnership class you will learn more about the purpose and mission of Christ's church, the mission of the FMCiC, and Northview's mission.

This class can be simply informational, to get to know us better. Or, if at the end you are ready to partner with us, then you will be invited to become a Northview partner. Speak to Pastor David for more information.



Serve our Neighbourhoods

Whether you choose to be a partner or not, Northview is committed to being a vital neighbour in our Argyle Park, Englewood and Hawkstone neighbourhoods. So there are lots of opportunities to serve our neighbours. In partnership with the Argyle Park North Community Association (ANCA), we host regular community events. We also host our own initiatives such as the Halloween Warming Centre. And, we are increasing our neighbourhood service through our LifePlan initiatives (for more information speak with Pastor David).

Small Groups

At Northview we have two types of small groups: Purpose Groups and Life Groups.

Purpose Groups are groups designed for a particular demographic or purpose such as our Seniors' group, our Moms' group, or our Youth groups. These are open to select people.

Life Groups are more open and diverse, encouraging people of all ages and stages to gather around how to live out our Christian lives in our daily life. These groups typically centre around sharing of our lives and struggles, discussion, prayer and Scripture. Often Life Groups gather around a meal together.

For people who have been a part of Northview for a long time, please be on the look out for new people to invite over. However, new people you too can take a risk and invite people home.


Your house doesn't need to be perfectly clean or tidy. Make the new friendship the priority instead.




