- \* You can wear whatever you are comfortable in, you don't need to "dress up"
- \* You can choose your seat, there isn't any saved seating, just make yourself comfortable
- \* We do take up an offering each week but you are not obligated to give any money; we would encourage you to give as you're able only when giving is understood as worship by you
- If you have any other questions, find a member of our welcome team and they will answer them for you!

## About Us

Northview Community Church is a member of **the Free Methodist Church in Canada**. The FMCiC is rooted in historic, orthodox Christianity. It has been influenced by the early Church Fathers, the Anglican Church, the Anabaptist movement, Methodism, the Holiness movement, and the wider Evangelical tradition. The FMCiC has an ongoing desire for renewal and reformation in personal spirituality, as well as in congregational and community life.

**Northview's mission** is to embody Jesus in our neighbourhoods. This means that we engage in God's mission to the world by being present to our neighbours in tangible, Christlike ways, both as individuals and as a Jesus community.

**Northview's vision** for community is to be meaningfully and powerfully led by the Holy Spirit through worship and prayer. The church makes a lasting difference in people's lives, connecting with the surrounding community and wherever God leads. We train as disciples of Jesus, are given the tools for lifelong learning, and serve in ministries where we are gifted. Everyone feels accepted, supported, and genuinely loved by others.

**Northview's staff** are responsible for equipping everyone who calls Northview home to grow in Christlikeness and to engage in God's mission in Argyle Park, Englewood, and Hawkstone, as well as in our own neighbourhoods.

Pastor David is the Lead Pastor and offers vision and direction for all the ministry at Northview.

Pastor Natasha is the Intergenerational Pastor and seeks to integrate all ages and stages of people into a discipleship community of Jesus.

Pastor Calvin is the Youth and Young Adults Pastor and ensures that discipleship is happening during times of life transition that comes with entering adulthood.

Pastor Carol is the Seniors Pastor and forms community of support for seniors, integrating them into the whole life of the church.

Scripture Centred

We believe that Scripture, understood through the person of Jesus, should be at the centre of who we are and what we are to do. By doing this we ensure that we remain kingdom focused (Luke 24:27; 2 Timothy 3:16–17).

Missionally Minded

We believe that mission is the reason for the church's existence. Scripture describes God's great mission to redeem and renew all of his creation, particularly humanity. God has called us to participate in that mission, in the power and under the direction of the Holy Spirit. (Matthew 28:18–20; John 20:21; Acts 1:8).

**Community Oriented** 

We believe the community called church is a new family. This means we intentionally invite people to become a part of our life together. As well, we foster an environment in which we openly share what is happening in our lives with each other and seek to respond to each other with love and concern. We also seek to be a place of healing for all people (Mark 3:34–35; Acts 2:44–45; James 2:15–17, 5:13–16).

Discipleship Focused

We believe that God is transforming us into the image of his Son. This means that we are intentionally submitting ourselves to be re-formed through daily practices that lead to spiritual growth. We also recognize that at the heart of our mission as a church, we are to disciple others through those same daily practices (Matthew 28:18–20; Romans 12:2).

Spiritually Equipped

We believe that God has gifted his body of believers, men and women equally, for the work of discipling and mission. Every believer has been equipped by God's Spirit to build up the body and/or to do works of service for the world. Everyone is encouraged to discover their gifts and share them to the best of their ability (Romans 12:4–8; 1 Corinthians 12:1–11; Ephesians 4:11–13).

**Prayer Dependant** 

We believe that prayer is essential to following after God. Like Jesus, we need frequent times when we are seeking God for a reaffirmation of our identity as God's people and a reminder of our mission. Like Scripture, prayer is a major discipline for our corporate body (Matthew 6:9–13; Mark 1:35; Acts 4:23–31).

**Worship Driven** 

We believe that authentic worship is everything that honours God. Worshiping God is the greatest fulfilment of our vocation to be bearers of God's image. Worship is an individual and corporate whole life offering which is grounded in our regular gathering for that purpose. Worship is about God first and last (Genesis 1:26–30; Exodus 20:1–17; Deuteronomy 6:4–5; Romans 12:1).



As a member church of the Free Methodist Church in Canada, Northview Community Church is led by a collaboration between the Lead Pastor (clergy) and a group of qualified partners (laity).

Meeting monthly (3rd Tuesday, typically), the Northview Board works together with the Lead Pastor to discern and set the direction for the ministry of the church body. Additionally, the Board handles the majority of the administration of the church's staff, buildings, and finances.

This document seeks to outline the roles and responsibilities that make up the Northview Board. For more detailed description of the Board and its officers, see chapter 3 of the FMCiC Manual (www.fmcic.ca).

Board Chair The Board Chair is responsible for organizing and facilitating the monthly board meetings. As Chair, they are also responsible to ensure that the meetings are on-topic, productive, and value everyone's time.

VICE-CHAIR The Vice-Chair is responsible to assist the Board Chair in her/his duties. At Northview, our Chair has tasked our Vice-Chair with the work of soliciting agenda items and creating the agenda for the board.

SECRE -TARY The Secretary records the minutes of all Board Meetings and Society Meetings. (S)he is responsible for the maintenance of these records.

The Treasurer is responsible to administrate the church's financial resources and report the financial status to the body.

The Delegate is responsible to maintain communication between the Free Methodist Church in Canada Head Office and Northview. (S)he conducts the Lead Pastor's annual 360 review and votes at General Conference.

**GFC** 

The Grounds and Facilities Liaison is responsible for ensuring the church's property is being maintained. Chiefly, this should entail organizing and overseeing volunteers and the church custodian.

### PRAYER Coord.

### **Truth & Reconciliation Team**

**The Truth and Reconciliation Team** helps Northview to engage in the conversation and action required for us to enter into Truth and Reconciliation with our First Nations neighbours. This team is led by Jaylynne Fox and consists of people who call Northview home and are passionate for healing to occur in this area.

#### **Truth and Reconciliation at Northview**

A few years ago Northview began to participate in the Truth and Reconciliation conversation by observing an "Orange Shirt Sunday." This was accompanied by reading a Treaty 4 Land Acknowledgement. Shortly after this, we included the Land Acknowledgement as a regular slide in our preservice scroll. Then in June of this year we participated in "the Blanket Exercise" led by Jonathan Maracle from Broken Walls and Adam Kline, who heads up the Intercultural Engagement Team for the Free Methodist Church in Canada.

During this ministry year we want to continue to engage in the Truth and Reconciliation conversation in a variety of ways. However, it is important for us as a church to understand **why** we are doing what we are doing and **what** we hope to accomplish.

#### Why We Are Engaging in Truth and Reconciliation

Some might think that we are simply bowing to the prevailing culture by joining this conversation. Some may fear that we are exchanging the "real" gospel of Jesus in favour of a "social" gospel. We want to be clear that our engagement in this work is both consistent with our mission and gospel-centric. Our church has discerned our mission to be: to embody Jesus in our neighbourhoods. We are engaging in this work because we believe that the Indigenous Peoples in Regina and the surrounding area are our neighbours and we are called to love them by extending the Shalom (peace) of the Kingdom that Jesus has established through his cross.

#### What We Hope to Accomplish Through This Engagement

As we've said before, the Indigenous Peoples are not a problem to be solved, but a people to be loved. So, we first of all hope to be obedient by loving our neighbours. And, through this obedience, we hope to become better ambassadors of the kingdom, so that our Indigenous brothers and sisters would know that they can embrace Jesus as Lord without having to give up their Indigenous identities. Additionally, we want to take responsibility for the hurts of the past that have an ongoing traumatic effect on the Indigenous Peoples today. This is not about assigning blame, but enabling healing to begin.

# Protection Teams

In order to worship, learn and grow as disciples, and engage in mission, Northview must be a safe place and a safe people. For this reason we have two Protection Teams: our Child Protection Team and our Sexual Conduct Team.

The Child Protection Team is led by Sarah Schuchardt and Kelsey Sawatzky. This team exists to ensure that our youngest and most vulnerable members are safe from spiritual, sexual, emotional, or physical harm. They accomplish this by ensuring that a Child Protection Policy & Procedures exists, that everyone working with children at Northview are trained in it, and that the Northview Kids leadership is following it. The Sexual Conduct Team is led by Pastor Carol Smith and comprised of people who call Northview home and who are passionate about keeping the people of Northview safe. This team exists to ensure that everyone who participates in the life of Northview is in fact safe from any kind of abuse, assault, or harassment. They accomplish this by establishing a Sexual Conduct Policy & Procedures that the leadership of Northview are trained in. Additionally, this team stands ready to be first responders in the event of an inappropriate incident. # Prayer Team

The Prayer Team is comprised of people who are gifted and passionate about prayer and people.

They exist to support the ministry of Northview and to pray for needs both inside and outside of our church.

## Worship Team

Northview's Worship Team facilitates regular opportunities for participants to give expression to their love of God, personally and corporately, in praise and worship.

Northview's Worship Team is comprised the following subgroups:

The Welcome Team ensures that everyone who comes to participate in worship at Northview is welcomed and comfortable in our collective worship space. They assist with needs such as seating, questions about the service, ensuring everyone who would like one has a copy of the bulletin. They also will direct newcomers to facilities such as the washrooms, kids classrooms, and the coffee bar. ## Other Teams
