Ephesians 1:3–14 | “Kingdom Worship is Trinitarian”

Worship is not about us. This might seem obvious but so often we forget it. When we do we start to think and act like our times of gather to worship should be about providing each one of us with a service to meet our needs. But kingdom worship is about giving the glory due to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit who has saved us.

October 26, 2025 | Reformation Sunday

Hebrews 10:1–18, 13:15–16 | “Kingdom Worship is Made Through Jesus”

Jesus is our mediator. It is him alone who has perfectly offered the worship sacrifice of obedience, fulfilling the will of God. So now Jesus is our Saviour and Mediator (and King) through whom we offer our own sacrifice of obedience and praise. Jesus mixed our imperfect worship with his own perfect worship and offers it to God.

November 02, 2025 | All Saints Sunday

1 Corinthians 11:17–22 | “Kingdom Worship is Corporate”

While worship is always personal it is never individual. Through the rite of baptism each one of us has been incorporated as an integral member of the body of Christ. It is the church who worships God. When we forget this and start thinking selfishly all sorts of hurts and abuses happen, as well as failure to truly worship.

November 09, 2025

Colossians 1:15–20 | “Kingdom Worship is Missional”

While the practice of worship is the highest activity we as human beings can engage in, it is not complete because there are those who still do not know God. So a key element of true kingdom worship is inviting all people to enter the kingdom, to know God, and to worship him.

November 16, 2025

2 Corinthians 3:12–18 | “Kingdom Worship is Transformative”

We are fundamentally altered by the people with whom we spend the most time. It’s why we are encouraged to choose our friends well. The same is true with worship. The object of our worship will fundamentally alter us. Which is why when we look with unveiled faces at Jesus we are being transformed into his image.

November 23, 2025 | Christ the King Sunday

Romans 12:1–2 | “Kingdom Worship is Costly”

There is no such thing as half-hearted worship. We cannot simply make a token offering—a little bit of money, a little bit of time, a little bit of obedience, or a little bit of love—and expect God to be pleased or ourselves to be changed. Only worship that gives all of ourselves to all of God’s self will transform and conform us.
