April 05, 2026 | Easter Sunday

Hebrews 1:1–4 | “The Radiance of God’s Glory”

The resurrection of Jesus was not a mere reanimation of the old person. No, that person was dead and buried. Jesus was the first to be raised to the new life that God has in store for all his people. Just as he was the means of creation so too he is the means of the new creation!

April 12, 2026

Hebrews 2:1–4 | “Remember What You’ve Heard”

It’s such a benign word, ‘drift.’ We can picture a boat floating away from the dock because it wasn’t tied up properly. It just drifts away. This is the same warning we receive: be careful to keep tied up to the testimony that you received at the first. To fail to do so is to risk destruction.

April 19, 2026

Hebrews 9:11–22 | “Christ Our High Priest”

The author of the Hebrews has no intention of running down the Jewish faith. Just the opposite in fact. They recognize what a gift of grace that faith was. It is because that faith was so precious that the value of the new covenant is even greater. Jesus is our high priest that leads us into the heavenly tabernacle through his blood.

April 26, 2026

Hebrews 11:1–6 | “By Faith”

Too often our culture wants to define faith as a blind belief in the impossible. That is not what faith is. Instead, faith is a confidence in the hope that we know is ours through Jesus. And, faith is our putting our trust in the plan of God to redeem us through the work of Jesus.

May 03, 2026

Hebrews 12:4–13 | “The Mark of Adoption”

We cannot expect to be embraced by everyone when Jesus was killed for who he was and the kingdom that he brought. This means we too will experience dislike. Understanding that God permits this discomfort and in some cases even persecution and death, we should experience this as a Father’s discipline fitting us for life to come.

May 10, 2026

Hebrews 12:18–29 | “Unshakable”

We are called to be an unshakable people. Again, the author compares the former things with the new things in Christ. At Sinai Israel was afraid because God shook the mountain. But now we have been brought to the mountain which is Jesus and we have nothing to fear!
