



Living in the Garden: A Reflection on Last Week's Sermon

Our lives are busy, messy, and complicated. We are motivated by a variety of things that contribute to the ways that we live within our communities. Because of this, it can be hard to see, sometimes, the unifying story that we all share. And that's where Jesus's parable about the vineyard comes in.

No matter how complicated and sophisticated we think our lives are, the bedrock claim of Scripture is that we do not belong to ourselves. We are creatures, made by the one and only God who made the heavens and the earth and declared them good.

Equally as bedrock is that, within time, we were tempted and decided to try to claim

God's creation for our own. And we have been trying to live on our own terms ever since. We want life, but without God.

The problem is that God is the source of all life. To absent ourselves from him is to choose a form of life that declines into death. And despite all the warnings and the writing on the walls of world history, we keep choosing death for ourselves. That history climaxes in the rejection of God's only Son, Jesus. When humanity condemns that perfectly innocent man to death, our rejection of God and his life was complete.

Thankfully, by God's grace, God uses our rejection of his Messiah as the very grounds and means of our deliverance and new life. This is God's grace. This is why we sing!

Ladies in Fellowship Together (LIFT)

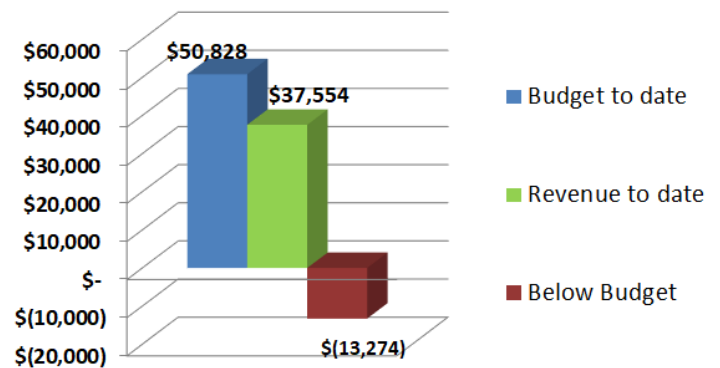
